- 17. Course Description: This trimester class is a revision of the Explor Tolerance 6 class. Topics that would be covered include:
 - a. Anti-Bullying and building safer environments at school and online
 - b. Intolerance related to: Race, Class, Sexual Orientation, Religion, Ability and Gender
 - c. Historical Movements: Civil Rights Movements: Women, African American, Cesar Chavez and the United Farm Workers
- 18. Course Goals and/or Major Student Outcomes: The goal is to increase students' awareness of how intolerance has affected lives and communities throughout history. Students will reflect about the role of intolerance in their own lives. They will learn about historical examples of intolerance in America and strategies used to overcome injustice. They will learn about the role of media in creating and reinforcing stereotypes. They will develop greater awareness about their peers, including the autistic population at LMS. They will draw connections between the issues they discuss in class and the current events related to intolerance.
