SECTION B. COURSE CONTENT

- 17. Course Description: This trimester class is an introduction to beginning Spanish. Students learn basic language and communication skills, play word games, sing, dance and get to know Spanish in a less academic way.
- 18. Course Goals and/or Major Student Outcomes: This Spanish class will help students decide whether they would like to continue with the more rigorous Spanish 1 course in 8th grade or in high school.
- 19. Course Objectives (standards): An in-between introductory class that would be more in-depth the 6th grade exploratory class and not as rigorous as the high school level yearlong class.
- 20. Course Outline: Modified from the first trimester of the Spanish 1 class with less academic rigor.
- 21. Instructional Materials:

- 22. Instructional Methods and/or Strategies: This class will focus on conversational Spanish with some games, book readings, fiestas, DVDs (music/dance) and grammar.
- 23. Assessment and Evaluation: Students will be assessed through their participation, quizzes, projects and a final project. There will be little homework assigned.
- 24. Grading Policy: Student grade will consist of the following three categories: participation, in-class work, projects, and quizzes.

SECTION C. OPTIONAL INFORMATION

- 25. Context for offering the course: Every year there is a dozen or so 8th graders who sign up for Spanish 1. They are not prepared to handle the amount of rigor that is involved in a high school level academic class. They struggle and ultimately either fail or do so poorly that they have to repeat the course in high school. Some of these students may be so turned off by their experience that they give up learning the language at all. We want to create a class which introduces students to Spanish but who are not ready to make the academic commitment necessary to be successful in a high school level class.
- 26. History of Course Description: Spanish 1 is an academically rigorous course in which students have the opportunity to learn the basic communication skills of listening, comprehension, speaking, reading and writing. Emphasis will be given to the development of oral fluency skills and improving pronunciation. There is also an introduction to the culture of Spain, Latin America and Southwestern United States.
