

# Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) Update

#### **LCAP 101**

- The LCAP (Local Control Accountability Plan) is a three-year districtwide plan to serve all students, with a focus on serving English Learners, low-income students, and foster youth.
- Districts set their own goals which guide accountability measures.
- District plans must include descriptions of goals, actions/services, and expenditures.

#### **LCAP 101**

- A district's LCAP is to be developed and adopted in tandem with the budget.
- The LCAP is the detailed description of a district's actions/services using Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) and other targeted funds.
- Specific narrative and fiscal description must accompany the use of LCFF Supplemental funding (targeted funding for unduplicated students).

#### **The 8 State Priorities**

There are eight state priorities that must be addressed:

- 1. Basic Services credentialed teachers, instructional materials, facilities
- 2. Implementation of state standards focusing on English Learner access to CCSS and ELD standards
- 3. Parent involvement
- 4. Student achievement
- 5. Student engagement
- 6. School climate
- 7. Access to broad course of study
- 8. Pupil outcomes in subject areas

• By July 1, 2015: Submission to ACOE

August 6, 2015: ACOE Clarifying Questions Received

September 24, 2015: Notice of Approval from ACOE

GOAL 1: (Student Engagement) Eliminate barriers to student success and maximize learning time

GOAL 2: (College and Work Readiness) Support all students in becoming college and work ready and demonstrating measured annual growth relative to their individual performance levels(s)

GOAL 3: (Parent/Guardian Engagement) Support parent/guardian development as knowledgeable partners and effective advocates for student success

GOAL 4: (Basic Services) Ensure that ALL students have access to the required basic services

# **District Advisory Committee (DAC)**

The DAC was formed in 2014-15 to provide a high-level group that represented all stakeholders in the district:

- Executive Cabinet members and selected district office staff
- Site Administrators
- Bargaining group leaders
- Additional Site Staff
- Parents/Guardians
- Students

#### **Employee LCAP Group**

The Employee LCAP group brings together representatives from each employee bargaining group and district office staff to gather input:

- Alameda Education Association (AEA)
- California School Employees Association (CSEA) 27
- California School Employees Association (CSEA) 860

# **Parent Advisory Committee (PAC)**

- The Parent Advisory Committee (PAC) brings together parents/guardians that represent the diversity of families and students present in our district:
  - One parent/guardian representative from each site nominated by principal
  - One representative from Parent Teacher Advisory Council (PTAC)
  - One representative from District English Language Advisory Council (DELAC)
  - Seven members selected on an at-large basis to ensure that the committee reflects the diversity of families and students present in our district
