What Are the Proposed Changes to BP 5111?

- Adds delegation directing to staff to create pilot program for enrollment of students from active-duty military families
- Consistent with recommendation made by Enrollment Committee
- One year only; Board must take additional action next year to extend

What Are the Proposed Changes to AR 5111.1?

- Clarifies documents required of all families
- Reflects recent changes to law governing residency verification investigations
- Creates two-step military family enrollment pilot program

Pilot Military Enrollment Program: Step 1

- Beginning May 1, out-of-state military families may provisionally enroll by electronically providing:
 - Military orders to assigning the parent/guardian to a military facility in Alameda;
 - Military ID;
 - Required immunization records for student;
 - Transcripts for child; and
 - Military Housing Agreement, signed lease, or deed.
- Not required for provisional enrollment
 - Utility bill
 - In-person appointment

Pilot Military Enrollment Program: Step 2

- By August 1, families must finalize enrollment by
 - Appearing for in-person appointment
 - Providing all documents required of all other families
- Provisionally enrolled students who do not complete step 2 will be removed from rolls

 August 1 deadline early enough to allow district to reassign those seats to other students

Pilot Military Enrollment Program: Legal Authority

- Structure consistent with other enrollment laws
 - Students who begin required course of immunizations provisionally enrolled on condition that they finish within set period (Cal. Health & Safety Code § 120375)
- Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children (Cal. Educ. Code § 49700-04)
 - Purpose to facilitate the "timely enrollment of children of military families" by ensuring they are "not at a disadvantage" (Cal. Educ. Code § 49701, Arts. I(A), I(F))
 - All other state laws conflicting with the Compact are superseded to the extent of the conflict. (Cal. Educ. Code § 49701, Art. XVIII(A)(2))

Pilot Military Enrollment Program: Legal Limits

- Applies only to out-of-state military families
 - Compact designed to ease transfer of families from one state to another, not within a state
 - In general, all in-state students must choose one California district of residency (Cal. Educ. Code § 48200)
- Scope limited to steps necessary to ensure military families "are not placed at a disadvantage"
 - Question whether proposed system removes a disadvantage or creates an advantage
 - Data generated by pilot would allow Board to more precisely gauge effect
