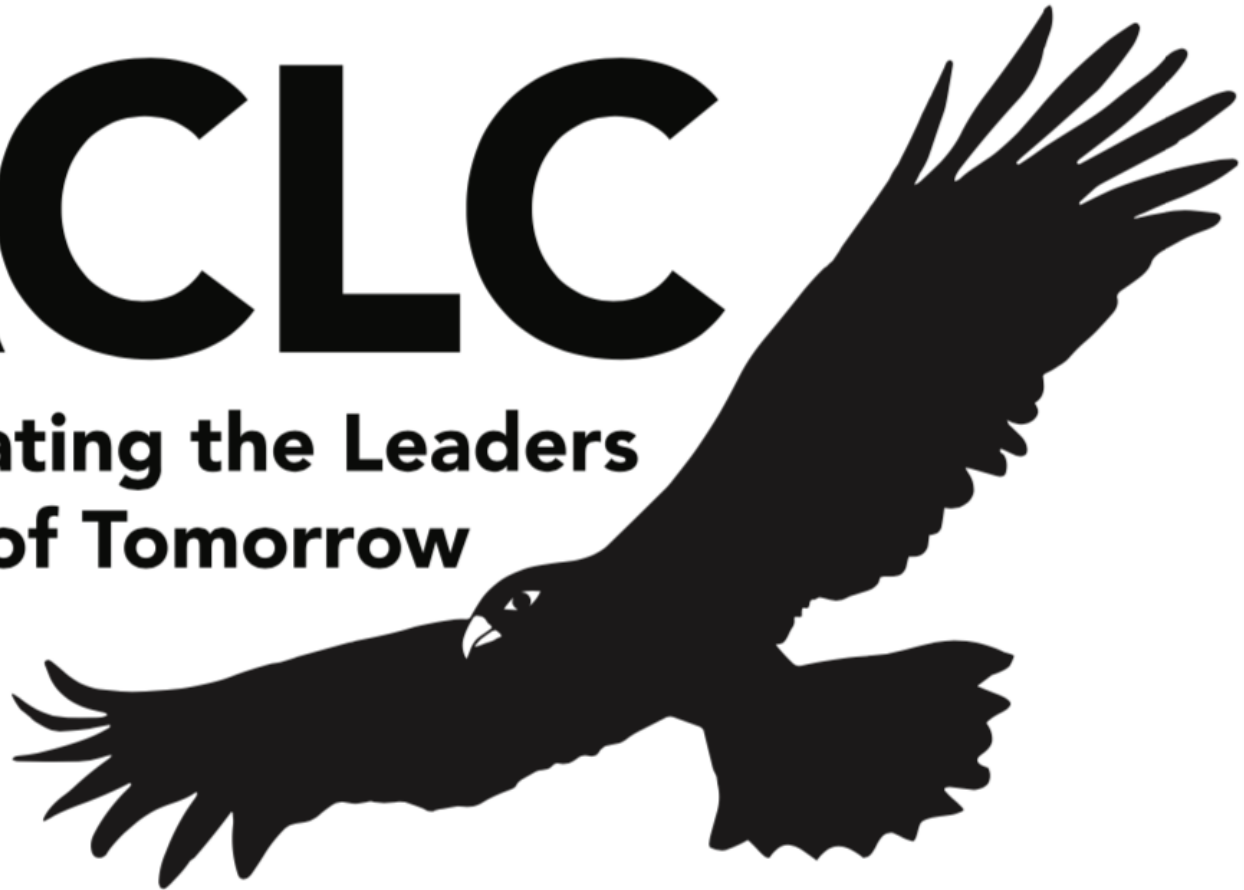

ACLC: Community & School Information

- Established in 1992 by Alameda Unified and funded through Arthur Andersen. Converted to Alameda Community Learning Center Charter School in 1997 and currently has an enrollment of 360 students in 6-12 grade levels.
- ACLC serves a diverse population of learners from Alameda, Oakland and beyond. ACLC is a unionized public charter school through the California Teachers Association.
- ACLC received a 6-year accreditation by the Western Association for Schools and Colleges (WASC) and is certified by the California Charter Schools Association



ACLC: Our Mission

The Alameda Community Learning Center's educational model empowers all youth to take ownership of their educational experience, to celebrate their diverse community, and to participate actively as members in a democratic society.

ACLC is based on self-directed and experiential learning model in which learners are supported by facilitators to be actively involved in the learning process, observe, analyze and reflect on the experience, and apply the understanding gained from that experience.

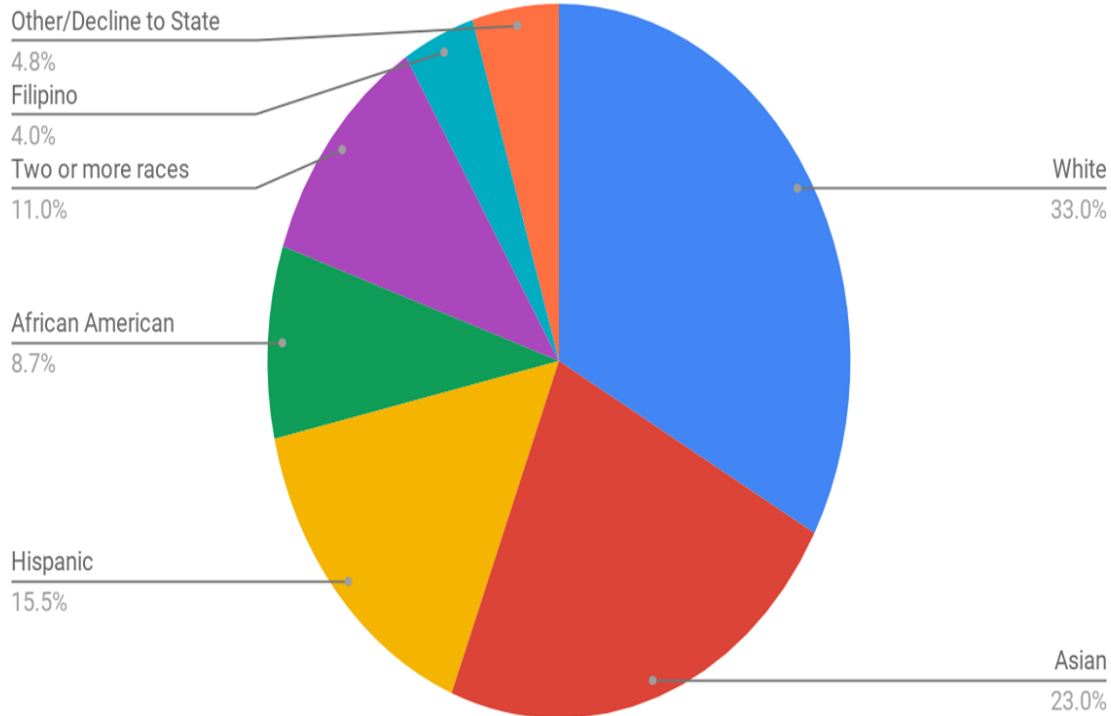
