

Why Island High School?

- 25:1 max student to teacher ratio
- Late start/Early finish (9am 2pm)
- No homework
- Work experience program to earn credit for working
- College of Alameda (CoA) Fab Lab partnership students learn to work with laser tools
- Concurrent enrollment opportunities on campus with support
- Access to mental health services, including Medi-Cal approved rooms for outside therapists
- Variably awarded credit this is key
- Acellus courses

Credit Recovery vs Early Graduation

Credit Recovery

- A student falling behind can earn credits at an accelerated rate to dig out of the hole they are in.
- A student can go on to graduate or transfer back to traditional school.
- Island is NOT A-G, so if a student transfers back, he/she may need to complete additional science credits to be able to graduate.

Early graduation

- Traditional: Island students are excited to find success in school and keep going. We currently average one junior a year who graduates.
- NEW: A senior who is not looking to go directly into a 4 year university, would only need to finish government/economics and additional elective courses to graduate.

What is Independent Study?

- Independent Study is on the quarter system
- Students take three classes per quarter
- It is NOT a Credit Recovery program
- Students attend a one hour weekly meeting with a credentialed teacher
- Students turn in assignments, get new assignments, and take assessments
- Students can participate in Acellus courses
- Students can have a Hybrid schedule of courses at their traditional high school and participate in Independent Study







Why Students Choose Independent Study

- Students who choose Independent Study want a different way to access the traditional school curriculum
- Transcripts reflect the student's home high school name
- Independent Study offers A-G courses with the exception of lab science and foreign language
- Independent Study offers a one-on-one setting, in an untraditional classroom
- Many current Independent Study students have chosen this program because they are experiencing social anxiety and/or have a 504 plan. Independent Study gives these students more flexibility




IHS vs EHS vs AHS
