Order of Priorities for Remaining 9 Full Weeks

- 1. Safe and successful return to campus for middle and high school students and safe end-of-year events (graduations, banquets, etc. *to the greatest extent possible*)
- 2. Work on negotiated agreements, prep, and planning for full K-12 reopening on August 16
- 3. Critical hiring at all levels of the District
- 4. Refine and finalize summer programming options

Summer Programming

- Expanding elementary seats from traditional average of 175 to a goal of 400
- Middle School program for the first time (Math focus)
- High School programs

TK-5 Reopening: Progress Report


- Daily screening and follow-up pushing bandwidth significantly implies an even larger challenge at middle and high school
- Daily checks of multiple reports:
 - Non-certified (not cleared for in-person)
 - Attendance
 - Med at home
 - Asymptomatic surveillance test report
- District nurses among MOST impacted
 - Arguably understaffed pre-covid
 - Screening follow ups tremendously time consuming
 - Growing backlog of care plans for chronic conditions, generalized screenings, staff training for paras, immunization compliance review

Current Program Placements for AUSD Elementary Students


AUSD Elementary Students Current Program Placement as of March 17, 2021

Concept for Extending the In-Person Time at TK-5


Action Steps:

- Survey the 915 K-5 flex families remaining in distance learning; dates = 3/18-3/25
 - a. Are you staying for medical or health-related concerns?
 - b. Are you staying because the current in-person schedule does not work for your family?
- Second Opportunity to enroll in the in-person elementary cohorts 3/29-4/4
 - New students assigned to A/B groups week of 4-5
 - Second group of in-person students join 4-19




Final Survey Results - Distance Learning Families

• Survey included questions about desire to return in an expanded schedule of 2 more traditional days per week, and why students would not return even under the expanded schedule offering.




Overall and Title 1 Schools Response Rates


- Overall, 121 students have committed to returning to on campus instruction on April 19th
- For Title 1 schools, 22 students have committed to returning to on campus instruction on April 19th.
- 884 students remain in distance learning prior to April 19th



Zoom Synchronous Instruction	In person instruction via zoom.

Asynchronous Student Time	Independent work time (could be assigned videos, classroom assignments, independent reading, etc.)
Family Communication and additional support time	Office hours, in person groups based on student need via zoom, individual family contact
Break/Lunch	Time for students to take care of their individual needs








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
Survey Results - Secondary Reopening

• Overall: 4,328 Secondary students currently enrolled in Flex Program; 2,158 Parents responded to survey and 2,986 Students responded to survey











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

Yes, I will return No, I will not return


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

Substitute Days: An Enduring Challenge with Imperfect Solutions

<i>Tier/Case Rate:</i>	Teacher is Ill or Symptomatic but can Still Teach	If Teacher Cannot Teach at All	NOTES
CR > 7.1	Teacher holds session virtually	Alternate staff covers class virtually	No in-person subs in the risk tier with respect to cohort stability
