Background

February 2016	AUSD announces plan to offer full-day kindergarten program at all elementary schools beginning in 2016-17 school year
August 2016	Full-day kindergarten program implemented (8:20 - 2:50)
August 2017	Paraprofessional FTE provided as pilot program to all kindergarten classrooms to support small-group instruction
April 2018	Board of Education confirms elimination of full-day kindergarten program effective 2019-20 and discontinuation of pilot paraprofessional support for small group instruction effective 2018-19
August 2022	Board of Education and staff expressed interest in exploring a full day schedule as a foundational goal in the strategic plan

Staff Recommendation

- Current recommendation is for Modified Full Day effective August '23
- 2. If the Board decides on Full Day Option, staff recommends implementation in August '24
 - Additional time for hiring planning
 - Additional time to identify approximately \$450,000 in ongoing reductions elsewhere in the General Fund
 - Modified full day could be a Board approved, cost-neutral interim step for Fall '23
 - Options could be revisited post-implementation in Fall of '23

Background, cont...

Why the change to a full day program?

- Current research shows that full-day kindergarten helps close the achievement gap
- A full-day kindergarten program confers significant social, emotional, and academic benefits on all kindergarteners
- We must offer a 9 hour day to all transitional kindergarten students and would like a smoother transition into kindergarten
- Our charter schools and private schools in Alameda all offer a full day program
- A majority of our district neighbors offer a modified full day program
- We have seen a steady loss of enrollment in kindergarten that could be due to the partial day program

Background, cont...

Why the change to a full day program?

Best Research Yet on the Effects of Full-Day Kindergarten (2014)

- The first-of-its-kind randomized trial of full-day kindergarten shows sizable learning advantages for full-day students at the end of the kindergarten year.
- Most notably, the advantage for Hispanic full-day students over other Hispanic kindergartners is nearly twice than seen in the overall sample.
- Positive effect for Hispanic students occurred even while raising outcomes for all students.
- A full-day of kindergarten made all students better off, while also closing the literacy achievement gap between Hispanic and non-Hispanic students by 70 percent.


If we transition to a full day or modified day kindergarten schedule it will require planning to address the following:

- Collaboration with our educators to establish a shared understanding of how best to deliver small group instruction
- Communication and revision of after school program contracts
- Communication with all after school program leads

Preliminary Teacher Input

What is your first reaction to thinking about implementing a full day K program next year?

11 responses



Consistent themes of narrative responses:

- Small group instruction
- Kindergarten students ability to sustain a full day schedule
- Class size
- Developmentally appropriate PE, Music and Media Center

Timeline for Transition

Staff will be working with kindergarten faculty across sites to implement the new kindergarten schedule if option 2 or 3 are chosen. Key steps in the transition process include:

- November: Decision on Option and timeline for implementation
- November May: Communication to community
- December (Option 3 only) BOARD will have to identify cut to budget to support additional FTE for specialist teachers to support contractual prep
- December: Board presentation on schedule and enrollment
- January: Kindergarten Information nights
- January 31 Must notify teachers of schedule (Contract)
- January May: Engage teachers in program transition
- May: Present update to Board
- August: Implementation of new schedule

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
