The ILT's primary role is to help lead the effort supporting the improvement of teaching and learning.

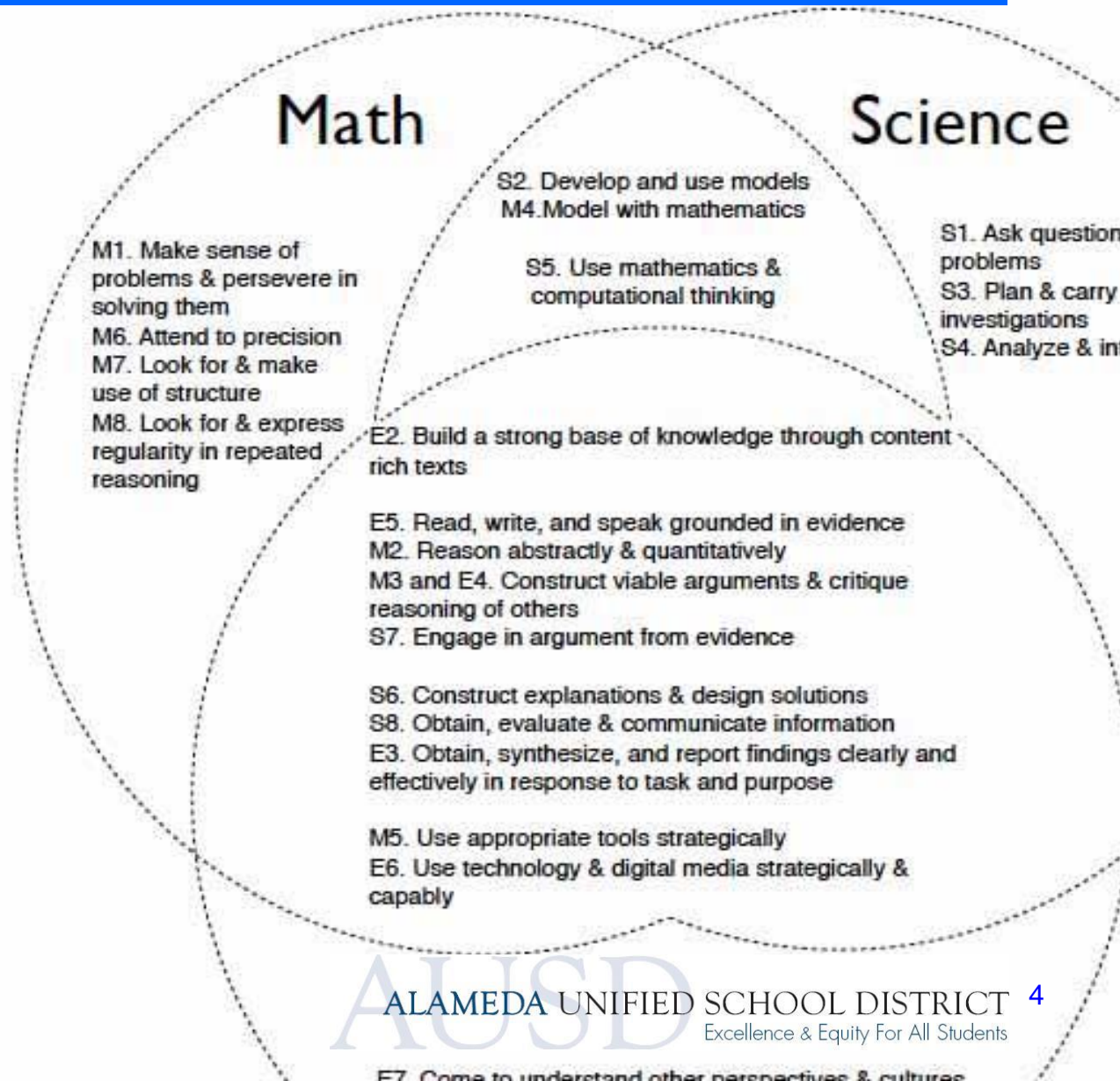
The ILT makes decisions about the district's/school's instructional program and leads and monitors the implementation of a sound instructional focus.

Instructional Rounds: Science

- Series of structured classroom observations of science instruction followed by debrief protocols
- Hosted by Encinal High School and Lincoln Middle School
- Preceded by professional development led by BaySci teacher leaders

Learning Labs: Inquiry by Design

- Multiple learning labs facilitated and hosted by IBD teacher leaders
- Held at Alameda High, Edison Elementary, Junior Jets, and Lincoln Middle
- Structure professional development including:
 - Pre-brief facilitated by teacher leader host and participating teachers observed
 - Observation of IBD lesson
 - Debrief at school site
 - Whole ILT debrief w/IBD professional developer facilitation

Systematic ELD Training

- Three full days of training for site administrators, teacher leaders, and district staff in systematic ELD:
 - Designated ELD
 - Integrated ELD
- Professional Development sessions from E.L. Achieve
- Time to plan ELD program transition and implementation
- Classroom observations of ELD instruction

Next Steps for 2015-16

- Increase coherence across initiatives
- Deepen understanding of CCSS, NGSS, ELD
- Maintain opportunities to observe instruction
- Maintain forum for collaboration between teachers and administrators
- Integrate and deepen work focused on equity
