Decrease class	% of students suspended each year
time missed due to discipline	% of students expelled each year
Improve completion rate	% of students in given cohort not finishing 8 th grade
	% of students in 9 th grade cohort not finishing 12 th grade
	% of students in 9 th grade cohort completing all graduation requirements

	% of students completing Career Technical Education (CTE) pathway

Increase College and Career Readiness	% of graduating seniors completing UC 'a-g' requirements
	% of 11 th grade students demonstrating college readiness via Early Assessment Program (EAP)
	% of Advanced Placement (AP) exams taken and passed with a score of 3 or more
	% of students enrolling in an Advanced Placement (AP) or college course

Efforts to seek input from parents/guardians	% of parents/guardians that feel informed about their student's progress in school
	% of parents/guardians completing annual parent/guardian survey
Promotion of parent/guardian participation	% of parents/guardians attending non- mandatory educational school events

Maintenance of a highly qualified teaching staff	% of teachers fully credentialed and highly qualified
	% of teachers qualified to teach English Learners
	% of teachers appropriately assigned
Provision of adequate instructional materials	Number of substantiated Williams complaints per year
Maintenance of a safe learning environment	% of facilities receiving a rating of 'good' or above on Facilities Inspection Tool (FIT)
