# BP 5116.1 Students Intradistrict Open Enrollment

The Board of Education desires to provide enrollment options that meet the diverse needs and interests of district students. The Superintendent or designee shall establish procedures for the selection and transfer of students among district schools in accordance with law, Board policy, and administrative regulation.

The parents/guardians of any student who resides within district boundaries may apply to enroll their child in any district school, regardless of the location of residence within the district. No pupil who currently resides in the attendance area of a school shall be displaced by pupils transferring from outside the attendance area. (Education Code 35160.5)

Students whose parent/guardian is assigned to a school site as his/her primary place of employment shall have the same enrollment priority at that school as students who reside within the school's zone of attendance (or for an open enrollment or magnet school, the school's priority zone). (Education Code 35160.5)

The Board shall annually review this policy. (Education Code 35160.5, 48980)

### **Enrollment Priorities**

Priority for attendance outside a student's attendance area shall be given as follows in the following order:

- 1. <u>Special Education students whose Individual Educational Program (IEP) mandates placement at a particular school site.</u>
- 2. To the extent required by law, If a district school receiving Title I funds is identified for program improvement, corrective action, or restructuring, all students enrolled in that school shall be provided an option to transfer to another district school or charter school. (20 USC 6316)
- <u>32. If while on school grounds a student Any student who</u> becomes the victim of a violent criminal offense while on school grounds who wishes to exercise his/her option under federal law, he/she shall be provided an option to transfer to another district school or charter school. (20 USC 7912)
- 43. Any student who If a student attends a school designated by the California Department of Education as "persistently dangerous," who wishes to exercise his/her option under federal law he/she shall be provided an option to transfer to another district school or charter school. (20 USC 7912; 5 CCR 11992)
- 5. Students seeking transfer out of a school on the state's Open Enrollment List (Education Code 48352, 48354)
- 6. Siblings of students currently enrolled at the school to which admission is sought. (Education Code 35160.5)
- 74. The Superintendent or designee may approve a student's transfer to a district school that is at capacity and otherwise closed to transfers upon finding that special circumstances exist that might be harmful or

dangerous to the student in the current attendance area, including, but not limited to, threats of bodily harm or threats to the emotional stability of the student.

To grant priority under these circumstances, the Superintendent or designee must have received either: (Education Code\_35160.5)

- a. A written statement from a representative of an appropriate state or local agency, such as a law enforcement official, social worker, or a properly licensed or registered professional, such as a psychiatrist, psychologist, or marriage and family therapist
- b. A court order, including a temporary restraining order and injunction
- 5. Additional admission priorities may be established for intradistrict enrollment requests.

6. Priority may be given to any student whose parent/guardian is assigned to that school as his/her primary place of employment.

For all other applications for enrollment from outside a school's attendance area, the Superintendent or designee shall use a random, unbiased selection process to determine who shall be admitted whenever the school receives admission requests that are in excess of the school's capacity. A school's capacity shall be calculated in a nonarbitrary manner using student enrollment and available space. (Education Code 35160.5)

Enrollment decisions shall not be based on a student's academic or athletic performance, except that existing entrance criteria for specialized schools or programs may be used provided that the criteria are uniformly applied to all applicants. Academic performance may be used to determine eligibility for, or placement in, programs for gifted and talented students. (Education Code <u>35160.5</u>)

No student currently residing within a school's attendance area shall be displaced by another student transferring from outside the attendance area. (Education Code 35160.5)

### Transportation

Except as required by 20 USC <u>6316</u> for transfers out of Title I program improvement schools, the district shall not be obligated to provide transportation for students who attend school outside their attendance area. However, upon request, the Superintendent or designee may authorize transportation contingent upon available space and funds.

## **Delegation**

The Superintendent or his/her designee is authorized to promulgate administrative regulations and standard operating procedures governing enrollment consistent with this policy. This includes the addition of admission priorities consistent with law and this policy.
