#### **Presentation Goals**

  - Option 1: No district action allow individual school sites to pursue later start time scheduling at their discretion
  - Option 2: Develop and implement plan for moving all secondary schools districtwide to schedules with later start times

## Highlights of April 25, 2017 Presentation

  - Demonstrated significant support from students, parents/guardians, and staff for starting school later, even if it ended later, with the value that afterschool activities (including sports) are maintained

### **Senate Bill 328 (Portantino)**

- Introduced in February 2017, SB 328 proposed to set the starting time for middle and high schools at no earlier than 8:30 a.m.
- After passing at the Senate on 5.30.17, the bill failed at the assembly on 9.14.17.
- Senator Portantino has said he would continue pressing the issue and may bring the bill back for a new vote next year.

### **Selected Scenarios for Later Start Times**

#### 1. Frameshift:

Slide the entire schedule later with no change to existing class length, passing periods, or other schedule features

#### 2. Optimization of Instructional Minutes:

Modification of existing schedule features to maintain compliance with instructional minutes requirements while striving to achieve earliest possible release time

### **Required Instructional Time**

Required days of instruction: 180

Required minutes/year for Grades 6-8: 54,000

Required minutes/year for Grades 9-12: 64,800

- Lunch time does NOT count as instructional time
- Passing time may count as long as it does not exceed 10 minutes
- Only ONE passing time for periods straddling a lunch break may count
- Study halls and home room may be considered instructional time if they are under the supervision of a credentialed teacher

#### **Additional Factors for Consideration**

- Potential movement of elementary school start times to adjust for later secondary start times
- Desire for standardized schedule across comprehensive high and middle schools

### **Next Steps**

- Board direction to staff on whether or not to proceed with plan for later start times at secondary schools
- If direction is to proceed, staff to work with site administrators, parent/guardians, students, and community stakeholders on best schedule
