2017-2018

- Backpacks distributed to 1002 students
- Free supplies to 47 teachers
- Purchased 80+ scientific and graphing calculators for high schools
- Doubled the amount of financial donations from the community over the prior year
- Community Partners: AUSD McKinney-Vento; Alameda Boys & Girls Club; Alameda Point Collaborative; Alameda Family Services; Operation Dignity; Woodstock Child Development Center

2018-2019

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- Continue to support Alameda students in need
- Support additional teachers with school supplies

2017-2018

- 177 teachers adopted = \$88,500
 - 73 teachers from Title I schools
 - 16 SPED teachers
 - Sponsors enabled 100% of each donation to go to the teacher

- 200+ teachers
- More "open" adoptions
- Increased sponsorship support

2017-2018

- 1,885 registrations
- Elementary and Middle School students
- School specific and Island-wide classes
- Bay Farm, Earhart, Edison, Franklin, Haight, Otis, Paden, Ruby Bridges, and Wood (4th and 5th grades)
- 5 Island-wide programs: Cross Country, Intro to Strings, String Orchestra, Elementary Beginning Band, and Elementary Advanced Band

- Improve communications about programs to AUSD families
- New scholarship allocation program
- New engaging classes and programs

Summer Camps Enrichment Program

2017-2018

- 688 registrations
- 46 camps
- 37 Interns (14 17 year olds)
- 5 weeks; June-July at Bay Farm
- Continued after-care partnership with ARPD

- Maintain camp participation numbers
- Consider new and innovative camps



College Prep Academy Enrichment Program

2017-2018

- College admissions programs
 - SAT workshops
 - ACT workshops
 - College essay courses
- Spring Break, Summer, and Fall
- 111 participants

- Introduce SAT practice test program
- Reach more students who are under-represented in college
- Be part of the high school planning process



Robotics

Enrichment Program

- Partnership with Alameda Robotics Center and Wood Middle School
- Lego Robotics; Grades 4 8; School based teams
- Promotes teamwork, creativity, and STEM principles
- > 10 12 "build" week; City wide competition in May

2017-2018

- Took-over administration of program
- Developed participation agreement, mentors/training, student registration, timeline, and pre-and post student surveys
- Funded mentors, kits for Title I schools, T-shirts, marketing, and competition expenses
- 6 schools; 12 teams; 90 participants
- Funded through partnership with AMP Power Up For Learning

- Increase the number of schools that participate
- Expand the program duration and number of participants per school

2017-2018

- 672 registrations
- Volleyball: 10 teams; 130 participants
- Girls Basketball: 10 teams; 102 participants
- Boys Basketball: 12 teams; 134 participants
- Track & Field: 306 participants (97 from Wood)
- Schools: Bay Farm (6-8), Lincoln, Wood, Encinal Jr. Jets, ACLC/NEA, and AOA
- Jack Capon awards to 8th graders

- Parents of scholarship recipients are given free season passes
- Facility prioritization
