D. COMMUNICATIONS

1. <u>Swearing in of Student Board Members:</u>

Superintendent Pasquale Scuderi performed the swearing in of student Board members Ruth Woldesemayat (Alameda High School) and Roan Byrne Sarno (ASTI).

2. Public Comments on Non-Agenda Items:

There were no public comments during this agenda item.

3. Written Correspondence:

The Board did not receive any correspondence related to this agenda.

4. Report from Employee Organizations:

Judy Ganley, Alameda Education Association (AEA): Ms. Ganley gave the Board an update recognizing the contributions of the district's speech and language pathologists, who recently shared their experiences with the Board. Trustees were reminded that these specialists, along with other educational staff, play a critical role in supporting students and bring unique perspectives to the district's work. Board members were invited to continue engaging with these professionals through listening sessions and other opportunities.

Ms. Ganley's report also included reflections on the transition from teaching to broader district responsibilities, noting both the challenges and rewards of this work. Upcoming bargaining sessions were highlighted, with the hope that discussions will be productive and lead to meaningful resolutions. The presentation on the unaudited actuals for 2024–25 was previewed, including the identification of significant unrestricted funds. Emphasis was placed on

ensuring that available resources are directed toward supporting today's students, educators, and learning conditions.

Amy Keegan, California School Employees Association, Chapter 27 (CSEA 27): Ms. Keegan announced CSEA recently elected two new officers: Alia Khan as Vice President for Office Tech, filling the seat vacated by Nilab Sarari, and Ben Peters as Site Rep Coordinator, filling the seat previously held by Laura West. Both will serve through December 31, 2026.

Ms. Keegan recognized and thanked Nilab for her service and welcomed the newly elected officers. Additional updates included regional appointments: Karen Keegan was reappointed as Mentor Regional Representative for Region 9, Alice Eide was appointed as Regional Secretary for Region 9, and Ms. Keegan announced she was reappointed as Regional Representative for Region 41

Ms. Keegan also announced its annual holiday party, scheduled for Wednesday, December 3, at 5:30 p.m. at the Elks Club. The event will feature a catered taco bar, an ornament exchange, door prizes, and fundraising activities to support the scholarship fund for graduating seniors who are children of CSEA Chapter 27 members.

5. Report from PTA Council:

The PTA Council did not make a report.

6. Board Members' Report:

Board Vice President Ryan LaLonde: Board Vice President LaLonde shared that he recently attended Back-to-School Night events held across the district. Positive feedback was shared regarding the events overall, with specific recognition of Alameda High School's program. The event was noted as well organized, with teacher presentations delivered effectively and within the allotted time.

Board Clerk Heather Little: Board Clerk Heather Little welcomed the two new student school board members and encouraged them to reach out with questions. She emphasized the importance of collaboration and highlighted the students' role as the eyes and ears on school campuses. Student Board members were invited to share not only school events but also broader issues and perspectives from their peers.

7. Superintendent's Report:

Superintendent Scuderi expressed appreciation for recent Back-to-School Night events and thanked school staff for opening classrooms for visits at multiple sites, noting the importance of staying connected to the district's core mission.

The Superintendent outlined the agenda, including a review of the unaudited actuals and ongoing budget discussions, emphasizing the district's three main priorities: attracting and retaining staff, investing in strategic programs such as early literacy and grades 4–8 math, and managing positions and programs within available funding. Additionally, the Superintendent highlighted an upcoming Alameda Education Foundation event on September 18, 2025, and

noted that the Gann limit would be discussed in a clear and straightforward manner during the meeting.

8. <u>Student Board Members' Report:</u>

Roan Byrne Sarno, ASTI: Student Board Member Roan Byrne Sarno reported that ASTI has launched its pen pal program pairing freshmen with leadership students, with a Mix It Up Lunch planned for the students to meet in person. Leadership celebrated Women's Equality Day on August 26 with student reflections in the quad, and ASTI has begun its voter registration and preregistration program with support from the League of Women Voters. Activities will include small group registration sessions and postcard reminders sent to students upon turning 18.

Student Board Member Roan Byrne Sarno noted Portable 8 on the College of Alameda campus continues to provide space for multiple campus uses, including band practice. He also noted the campus still lacks a dedicated gender-neutral restroom, requiring students to use the staff facility. Club applications are underway with Club Day scheduled for next Friday, and a new Spanish teacher, Ms. A, has joined the ASTI faculty.

Ruth Woldesemayat, Alameda High School: Student Board Member Ruth Woldesemayat announced the AHS Homecoming Football Game and Dance are this Friday, with the game starting at 7:00pm at Thompson Field. Ms. Woldesemayat also announced Alameda High School has an upcoming voter registration drive, and the school is currently celebrating Hispanic and Lantinx Heritage Month.

Student Board Member Ruth Woldesemayat stated the ELD Task Force is holding meetings every week during SMART period on Tuesdays and Thursdays to tutor ELD students.

F. GENERAL BUSINESS

1. <u>Presentation and Approval of 2024-2025 Unaudited Actuals Financial Report</u>
Assistant Superintendent of Business Services, Shariq Khan, presented the 2024-2025 Unaudited Actuals Financial Report.

He explained that the District conducts a year-end financial review to close its books, analyze revenues and expenditures, and determine final fund balances. The Unaudited Actuals provide a comparison of estimated versus actual financial activity and serve as the final update to the Board following interim financial reports.

Mr. Khan noted that, in compliance with Education Code Sections 42100 and 41020, the Unaudited Actuals must be approved by the Governing Board and submitted to the County Superintendent of Schools by September 15, and will also be subject to review by the District's independent auditor as part of the annual audit process.

The presentation included key financial highlights, budget variances, and the District's overall fiscal position for 2024-2025. Approval of the report ensures

compliance with state requirements and provides an accurate final accounting of the District's finances.

2. <u>Approval of Resolution No. 2025-2026.07 Adoption of 2024-2025 Gann Limit</u> In 1979, voters passed Proposition 4, which set a maximum limit on appropriations for the state and all local government jurisdictions. This limit is commonly known as the Gann Limit, named after Paul Gann, who authored the measure that enshrined the limit in the state constitution. In 1990, Proposition 111 amended the Gann Limit to allow for greater flexibility in its calculation.

Each year, the Gann Limit must be recalculated to ensure that district appropriations funded by tax revenues stay within the constitutional limits established by Proposition 4, as amended. The attached resolution establishes the district's Gann Limit for the 2024–25 fiscal year and confirms that the appropriations do not exceed the calculated limit.

Approval of this item ensures compliance with Article XIII B of the California Constitution and is a required annual action.

3. Resolution No. 2025-2026.10 Providing Authorization to Hire on Provisional Internship Permits (PIP)

Provider's installation responsibility is limited to (i) connecting the Equipment to the fully-functioning electric panels, breakers conduits, and wiring that supply adequate electricity; and (ii) the commission of the Equipment on the Blink Network. Provider undertakes to: use licensed professional services and obtain all necessary permits to install the Equipment within sixty (60) days following the execution of this Agreement, subject to Client completing its Make Ready Requirements. The Parties will execute an Installation Date Acknowledgement Certificate (Schedule IV) on the date of Provider's installation to establish the Effective Date.
- **1.4 Services**. Provider will service and operate the Equipment at the Designated Areas for the Term (defined below).

2. Term and Termination

- **2.1 Initial Term.** The initial term of this Agreement shall be for a period of five (5) years commencing on the Effective Date ("**Initial Term**").
- **2.2 Renewal Term; Term.** At the end of the initial five-year term, the Client may twice elect to extend for another five-year term.
- **2.3 Termination.** Provider may choose to terminate this Agreement by delivering Client a 180-day written notice of its intent to terminate prior to the expiration of the Term or any applicable Renewal Term.
- 2.4 Termination Fee; Removal Cost. In the event Client elects to terminate this Agreement prior to the end of the Initial Term, Client agrees to pay Provider a termination fee per the termination fee schedule, based on a five (5) year period from the installation of the Equipment (Schedule II) (the "Termination Fee"). If Client terminates the Agreement at any time during the Term (including throughout any of the Renewal Terms) Client will be subject to a removal fee, in the amount of \$750 for every five EV charging stations removed, plus applicable shipping costs, which will cover the removal of the Equipment and shipment of the Equipment back to Provider's facility in the US (the "Removal Cost"). However, Client shall not be subject to payment of the Removal Cost if it chooses to independently remove the Equipment and ship the Equipment to Provider's facilities in good operating condition.
- 2.5 Removal of Equipment. Provider shall have the right, but not the obligation, upon the termination or expiration of this Agreement, to enter upon the Property within sixty (60) days after such termination/expiration and to remove any and all Equipment (which all right, title, and interest in said Equipment shall at all times during the term of this Agreement, be deemed property of Provider) as well as any other ancillary property of Provider relating thereto. Provider shall coordinate the removal of Equipment with Client.

3. Equipment

- **3.1 Supply**. Provider shall supply the Equipment listed on Schedule II hereof, shortly after the execution of this Agreement.
- **3.2 Ownership.** All rights, titles and interests in and to the Equipment shall, at all times during the Term, be and remain the property of Provider. Provider's ownership shall include, but not be limited, to all hardware, software, records, files and/or data collected or produced by the Equipment (the "**Proprietary Data**"), as well as any and all environmental (or similar) credits generated by the Equipment or the use or disbursement of electricity by the Equipment.
- **3.3 Grants and Rebates.** Provider holds all right, title, and interest in and to any grants and/or rebates received, or which may be received in the future, in connection with the installation, and/or operation of the Equipment and/or the Network under this Agreement. If any grant and/or rebate is received in the name of the Client or its subsidiaries, Client expressly agrees that this Agreement shall act as an assignment of its right, title, and interest in and to such grant and/or rebate.

____ (Client initials)

3.4 Additional Equipment. Provider may assess, from time to time, the need for additional Equipment on the Property based on certain parameters and make its recommendations to the Client. If accepted: (i) Client shall complete the Make Ready Requirements at the locations for any additional Equipment and carry all associated costs; (ii) the Parties will execute an Installation Date Acknowledgement Certificate (Schedule IV) for the additional Equipment, which will establish a new Effective Date.

- **3.5 Markings.** Provider shall ensure the Equipment is clearly marked with the following information for users: (i) Provider's contact information for complaints, notification, and service issues and (ii) a statement of Provider's responsibility to service issues, damages, or loss.
- 3.6 Property Condition. Client agrees, at its own expense and at all times during the Term, to keep the electrical installation (panels, breakers conduits, and wiring), public areas, streets, and sidewalks appurtenant to any Designated Areas, reasonably free of debris and rubbish, and in good repair and condition. In addition, Client shall provide and maintain, in compliance with any applicable codes and statutes, such outdoor lights and lighting as may be necessary to illuminate the Designated Areas and Equipment.
- **3.7 Internet Connection.** In the event the Equipment cellular signal is not available or non-functioning, Client will allow Provider to access its Wi-Fi network or wired ethernet (LAN) if such networks are available at the Property.
- **3.8 Signage**. Client will install and pay all costs and expenses associated with signage that Provider will supply for marking the spot in the Designated Area(s) as EV charging station area(s).

4. Access to Equipment

4.1 Client grants Provider a license for Provider, its employees, agents, and vendors to enter upon the Property at any time (and to the extent possible, with notice to Client), for the purposes of inspecting, servicing, and maintaining the Equipment. Client shall not interfere with Provider's services, maintenance, or data collection from the Equipment, or its other responsibilities under this Agreement.

5. Licenses/Permits

Client must obtain all necessary licenses and/or permits to complete the Make Ready Requirements at the location and for the operation of the Equipment and shall be exclusively responsible for any citations as a result of any default hereunder.

6. Maintenance and Service

- 6.1 Provider will service and operate the Equipment.
- 6.2 Provider will maintain and replace the Equipment as necessary to keep the Equipment in proper working order.
- 6.3 Provider will make available technical service support personnel to promptly service the Equipment in a commercially reasonable manner.
- 6.4 If Client knows, or becomes aware, of any actual or potential claim against Provider by any person or entity, or any actual or potential malfunction of the Equipment, Client shall promptly notify Provider upon discovery of such claim or malfunction.
- 6.5 If the Equipment requires maintenance or replacement due to issues arising from Client's completion of the Make Ready Requirements, Client shall be responsible for carrying the costs associated with such services.

7. Payments and Fees

- **7.1 Collection of Revenue**. Provider will record the Equipment usage and collect all revenue generated by the Equipment.
- **7.2 Revenue Payment**. Provider shall remit to Client revenue share of zero percent (0%) net revenues per month ("**Revenue Payment**").
- 7.3 "Net Revenues" are defined as the gross revenues generated from the Equipment through EV charging fees and advertising ("Gross Revenues"), minus: (i) any and all taxes paid by Provider, (ii) transaction fees of eight percent (8%) of Gross Revenues, (iii) \$20.00 per month, per charging station in network/connectivity fees related to the operation of the Equipment, and (iv) any electricity charges incurred by the Equipment.

- 7.4 If the Gross Revenues does not cover the fees, the client will not be responsible for any remaining fees.
- 7.5 Client waives all claims for any additional payments beyond the Revenue Payment except for electricity reimbursement.
- **7.6 ACH Payments.** Client will obtain its monthly Revenue Payments through direct electronic transmissions (ACH Payments) by providing its banking information to Provider and executing the ACH form attached as Schedule V hereof. Client agrees that unless Client executes the ACH Form, no Revenue Payment shall be processed to Client unless and until either (i) the aggregate amount due to Client (including the Revenue Payment and the Electricity Reimbursement (defined below)) exceeds \$50.00 or (ii) it is January 15th and there are unpaid Revenue Payments due to Client as of December 31st of the previous year.
- 7.7 **Session Limits.** Provider shall be solely responsible for managing issues relating to session time limits, advertising fees, or other charges relating to the use of the Equipment.

Electricity.

7.8 Client Electric Meter. Client shall provide all utility service for the charging stations covered in this agreement.

Provider shall issue the electricity reimbursement to Client on or before the fifteenth (15th) day of each month subsequent to the applicable monthly revenue period. An activity report for the reported month detailing: (i) the number of transactions, (ii) the Gross Revenues, and (iii) the Fees will accompany each Revenue Payment.

- **7.9 Equipment Upgrade**. During the Term, Provider, at its sole discretion, may upgrade the Equipment within the Designated Areas. Provider shall be solely responsible for all costs associated with such upgrade.
- **7.10 Relocation**. During the Term, Client shall not unreasonably withhold its approval of Provider's request to relocate or remove underperforming Equipment from a specific location to a different location within the Designated Area(s). Provider shall be responsible for all costs associated with the relocation or removal of the Equipment. In the event the relocation or removal of the Equipment is made due to the determination of the Client or a third party, Client shall be responsible for all costs associated with the removal and/or relocation.

8. Press Releases and Public Filings

- 8.1 Provider and/or its parent may disclose information relating to this Agreement in any manner necessary to comply with any regulatory responsibilities under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 or other applicable law.
- 8.2 Provider and/or its parent may release information concerning this Agreement as a press release substantially similar to the draft press release attached as Schedule VI hereto.
- 8.3 Client agrees that Provider may use Client's name and logo as a customer in its marketing materials with prior written approval.
- 8.4 Client may not disclose any information relating to this Agreement without obtaining Provider's prior written approval.

9. Exclusive Right and Option

9.1 EV Exclusivity. Client hereby grants Provider with an exclusive right to install, maintain, service, and operate any EV charging equipment on the Property during the Term.

10. Indemnification

10.1 Each party shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the other party and its officers, directors, employees, and agents from and against any and all third-party claims, demands, actions, damages, liabilities, losses, and expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees and court costs) to the extent arising out of:

- bodily injury, death, or damage to tangible property caused by the gross negligence or willful misconduct of the Indemnifying Party or its employees, agents, subcontractors, or consultants in connection with this Agreement; or
- a material breach of this Agreement by the Indemnifying Party;
 or
- in the case of Provider, any actual or alleged infringement of a third party's intellectual property rights arising from the use of Provider's services, deliverables, or materials.

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This indemnity obligation shall survive the termination or expiration of this Agreement.

11. Limitation of liability

- 11.1 Except for liability arising from:
- (a) gross negligence or willful misconduct;
- (b) fraud or intentional misrepresentation;
- (c) breach of confidentiality obligations;
- (d) infringement or misappropriation of intellectual property rights;
- (e) obligations to indemnify under this Agreement; or
- (f) personal injury or property damage caused by negligence.

In no event shall either party be liable to the other for any indirect, incidental, special, consequential, or punitive damages, including but not limited to loss of profits, loss of data, business interruption, or loss of goodwill, arising out of or related to this Agreement, except to the extent such damages are the result of a party's breach of confidentiality, data protection obligations, or indemnified claims.

12. Confidential Information

12.1 Intentionally omitted.

13. Injunctive Relief

- 13.1 Provider shall be entitled to enforce each of the obligations and restrictive covenants by means of injunctive relief or an order of specific performance and such remedy shall be available in addition to all other remedies available at law or in equity.
- 13.2 In such action, Provider shall not be required to plead or prove irreparable harm or lack of an adequate remedy at law or post a bond or any security.

14. Privacy

- 14.1 Where a Party provides or makes available personal information to the other Party in connection with this Agreement, the first Party must: (i) comply with all Privacy Laws in relation to that personal information; and (ii) take all steps that are reasonable in the circumstances to keep that personal information safe and secure.
- 14.2 Privacy Laws. To the extent that any Confidential Information provided to Client includes Personal Information or Personal Data, Client agrees to comply with all applicable federal and state privacy laws, including but not limited to the California Consumer Privacy Act (CCPA). Client is a public agency and subject to the California Public Records Act (CPRA) and other transparency laws, and nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to prevent Client from complying with its legal obligations under those laws. Client shall not transfer Personal Data received from the Vendor to jurisdictions outside the United States unless required for performance of the Agreement and permitted under applicable law.

15. Force majeure

15.1 If either party is delayed in or prevented from the performance of any act required under this Agreement by reason of any strike, lockout, labor trouble, inability to procure materials or energy, failure of power, weather, restrictive governmental laws or regulations, riot, insurrection, picketing, sit-ins, war, pandemic or other unavoidable reason of a like nature not attributable to the negligence or fault of Provider, the performance of such work or action will be excused for the period of the unavoidable delay and the period for the performance of any such work or action will be extended for an equivalent period.

16. Dispute resolution

- 16.1 This Section 16 applies to any dispute which arises between Provider and Client in connection with this Agreement ("**Dispute**").
- **16.2 Amicable Resolution.** If either Party considers that a Dispute has arisen as a result of the conduct of the other Party, it may issue a notice to the other Party, setting out reasonable particulars of the conduct which gives rise to the Dispute ("**Dispute Notice**"). The Parties must promptly hold discussions between their representatives after the issue of a Dispute Notice to attempt to resolve the Dispute (the "**Discussion**").
- 16.3 If the Dispute has not been resolved within ten business days following the Discussion, either Party may pursue its rights and remedies under this Agreement as it sees fit.
- **16.4 Court Proceedings.** Notwithstanding the above, Provider may, at any time, commence court proceedings in relation to a Dispute or claim arising in connection with this Agreement.
- **16.5 Governing Law and Jurisdiction.** This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of California without regard to conflict of laws. Any suit involving any Dispute arising under this Agreement may only be brought in State or Federal Court of Alameda County, California, which shall have exclusive jurisdiction over the subject matter of the Dispute.
- 16.6 To the extent permitted by applicable law, each party knowingly and voluntarily waives its right to a trial by jury in any legal action or proceeding arising out of or relating to this Agreement. This waiver shall not apply to the extent it would violate any constitutional, statutory, or regulatory rights of a party, including but not limited to any limitations imposed on public entities under California law. Nothing in this section shall be construed to waive any rights or defenses available to either party under applicable law.

17. Notice

- 17.1 Any notice required to be given or otherwise given pursuant to this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be: (i) hand-delivered, or (ii) mailed by certified mail, return receipt requested, or (iii) sent via recognized overnight courier service to the addresses listed above, or (iv) transmitted by fax, or (v) by email.
- 17.2 Notwithstanding Section 17.1, above neither Party may use email or fax transmissions to give notice of breach or termination to the other Party, such breach/termination notice must be sent by certified mail return receipt requested.

18. Insurance

18.1 Each Party shall hold and maintain, at all times during the Term, general liability insurance policies with coverage limits according to the reasonably perceived risks associated with each Party's responsibilities under this Agreement and in accordance with standard industry practice.

19. General

- 19.1 Nothing in this Agreement shall constitute or be deemed to constitute a partnership or joint venture between the parties hereto or constitute or be deemed to constitute any Party as the agent or employee of the other Party for any purpose whatsoever, and neither Party shall have authority or power to bind the other or to contract in the name of, or create a liability against, the other in any way or for any purpose.
- 19.2 Client agrees to comply with all applicable laws, statutes, regulations or rules, including those of applicable self-regulatory bodies in its performance of this Agreement.
- 19.3 Client may not assign, in whole or in part, or novate its rights and obligations under this Agreement without the prior written consent of Provider.
- 19.4 This Agreement supersedes all previous agreements about its subject matter. This Agreement embodies the entire agreement between the parties.
- 19.5 A right under this Agreement may only be waived in writing signed by the party granting the waiver and is effective only to the extent specifically set out in the waiver.
- 19.6 This Agreement may be signed in any number of counterparts. All counterparts together make one instrument. This Agreement may be signed electronically.
- 19.7 Client Representation: If Client is not the Property Owner, or Leaseholder of the Property, and in the case of a leaseholder, if Client does not have authority to carry out its obligations under this Agreement pursuant to its lease agreement with the Property Owner, Client hereby expressly warrants that it will obtain the Property Owner or Leaseholder's signature in the section of the signature panel titled "Property Owner/Leaseholder's Acceptance and Agreement." SCHEDULE III – MAKE READY REQUIREMENTS

Client shall be responsible for the make-ready work as required to facilitate the final installation of the charger pedestal(s) and charger(s) included under the Agreement. Provider will be responsible for the installation of the pedestal(s) and charger(s) on top of the make-ready work to provide a complete and functional installation without any additional work or adjustment to the make-ready installation provided by Client.

The make-ready requirements include the following configurations:

- Dual-port Charger with Pedestal on Concrete Pad
- Single-port Charger with Pedestal on Concrete Pad

A dual-port charger is an assembly of aSeries 8 (ISO Model) unit on a common triangular pedestal. The dual-port charger can be configured to share a single circuit or to have dedicated circuits for each port. The agreement will specify the applicable wiring configuration to be installed as part of the makeready.

Please note that any variation to these requirements must be approved in writing by Provider.

General Requirements - applicable to all configurations

- The following materials are required to be submitted to Provider within 30 days of Agreement execution.
 - O A scaled Site Plan shall be provided that provides the following minimum information with respect to the installation:
 - Client name, site address
 - Parking lot layout including all travel lanes and ingress/egress
 - Location of source electric panel
 - Location of charger pedestal(s)
 - Conduit run from source panel to charger pedestal(s)
 - Location of disconnects, if any
 - Location of bollards, wheel stops, or other protective means to be installed
 - One-line electrical diagram for the circuits
 - O Photos of electric source panel, typical grade conditions where trenching, and pedestal location(s)
- Make-ready work will not commence until Provider has reviewed and accepted the above materials and Client has secured any required permits.
 Provider reserves the right to make edits on-site plan prior to construction by Client for ADA compliance and/or other make-ready requirements
- All work shall be in conformance with the National Electric Code, latest edition, and all requirements of the local Authorities Having

MORATORIUM PAVING

Before work begins, EBMUD will obtain an encroachment permit from the City or County having jurisdiction in your area. If there is a paving moratorium on the section of roadway where your service will be installed, the City of Alameda will require that the existing pavement is restored and re-sealed to their moratorium paving standards, which could be a larger area than the standard trench.

Please be advised that if moratorium paving restoration is necessary, the Applicant is responsible for the additional cost associated with the restoration as it is not covered under this estimate. Under this scenario, the Applicant has the option to make arrangements with a contractor to perform the moratorium paving restoration or request EBMUD to perform the restoration following the installation. If you wish to have EBMUD perform the restoration, you will be provided with a separate cost estimate in addition to the original estimate. The cost for EBMUD to perform pavement restoration work is currently in the range of \$3,500 - \$5,000.

ENGINEERED TRAFFIC CONTROL PLANS (TCP)

For encroachment permit applications that require an engineered and stamped traffic control plan, the cost for this additional requirement will be borne by the applicant. A separate cost letter will be forwarded to you outlining the fees if it is required. Kleinfelder, Inc.

Background: Soil contamination was discovered during excavation for the Board-approved

Alameda High School Swim Center Modernization project. Since October 2024, Kleinfelder, Inc. ("Kleinfelder")—working under Alten Construction, the prime contractor—has been addressing environmental impacts to keep the

project moving forward.

Beginning in February 2025, the Alameda County Environmental Health Department (ACEHD) assumed regulatory oversight of this work. Initially, ACEHD's role was limited to the active project site. However, ACEHD has recently required the District to expand investigations into areas outside the project boundaries and made clear that this work must be completed before

construction can restart.

Because this new scope falls outside Kleinfelder's existing subcontract, the District must now directly retain their services. Under Government Code section 4525 et seq., the District would normally conduct a competitive selection process for professional environmental services. However, staff determined that doing so would delay work by 4–8 weeks and increase project costs. In addition, replacing Kleinfelder would create added risks: a new consultant would need to familiarize themselves with the site, rebuild trust with ACEHD, and replicate work already underway. This would further jeopardize project schedules and increase costs.

Kleinfelder has provided a proposal for the required additional work, and staff have reached a tentative agreement with them, which will be presented to the Board for approval at a subsequent meeting.

Staff recommend that the Board approve the attached resolution authorizing the District to enter into an agreement with Kleinfelder to perform the additional environmental work required by ACEHD.

Resolution Declaring the Futility of Utilizing Competitive Selection Process to Award Construction-Related Services Agreement to Kleinfelder, Inc.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the District's Governing Board hereby finds, determines, declares, orders and resolves as follows:

WHEREAS, the foregoing recitals are true and correct; and

WHEREAS, since October 2024, Kleinfelder, Inc. ("Kleinfelder") has been addressing environmental impacts encountered during the Swim Center Modernization project ("Project") as a consultant under contract with the prime contractor for the Project, Alten Construction; and

WHEREAS, the environmental impacts on the Project include soil contamination, which was discovered during excavation, and which resulted in the Project being suspended; and

WHEREAS, since February 2025, the Alameda County Environmental Health Department ("ACEHD") has been providing regulatory oversight for the Project; and

WHEREAS, while until recently, the ACEHD's oversight had been limited to the site of the Project, the ACEHD is requiring immediate action by the District to investigate areas outside of the Project site, and indicated these investigations were required to obtain County approval to restart construction of the Project ("Additional Work"); and

WHEREAS, with the expanded scope of ACEHD's oversight, the District is now required to separately retain Kleinfelder to perform the Additional Work requested by ACEHD; and

WHEREAS, Government Code section 4525, et seq. requires that the District employ a competitive selection process for the procurement of environmental consulting services. However, this would result in a four-to-eight-week delay in addressing the urgent comments from ACEHD. The delays would also impact construction of the Project, resulting in change orders for extended general conditions; and

WHEREAS, Kleinfelder has provided a proposal to perform the Additional Work, and the District and Kleinfelder have come to a tentative agreement, which will be presented to the Board for approval at a subsequent meeting; and

WHEREAS, California law provides that, "Where competitive proposals work an incongruity and are unavailing as affecting the final result or where they do not produce any advantage . . . the statute requiring competitive bidding does not apply" (Hiller v. City of Los Angeles (1961) 197 Cal.App.2d 685, 694), and that public entities need not comply with competitive bidding processes where to do so would be impractical or futile and would not serve the purposes of competitive bidding. (Graydon v. Pasadena Redevelopment Agency (1980) 104 Cal.App.3d 631.); and

WHEREAS, Kleinfelder is uniquely qualified to continue this work:

- They are ACEHD's established day-to-day technical point of contact.
- They are familiar with site history, data sets, and regulatory expectations.
- ACEHD has confirmed Kleinfelder's work is technically sound and professionally executed.
- Their team includes engineers, geologists, and toxicologists to address all ACEHD requirements; and

WHEREAS, Replacing Kleinfelder would create schedule and cost impacts, and force a new consultant to ramp up, learn the site, and rebuild agency trust—introducing risks of mistakes and continuity gaps. Furthermore, the additional time is likely to result in additional costs to the District in the construction of the Project; and

WHEREAS, Meakin v. Steveland (1977) 68 Cal.App.3d 490 and Los Angeles Dredging v. Long Beach (1930) 210 Cal. 348 hold that statutes requiring competitive bidding do not apply when competitive bidding would cause an incongruity or not produce any advantage.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Governing Board of the Alameda Unified School District does hereby find, resolve, determine, and order as follows:

- **Section 1.** That all of the recitals set forth above are true and correct.
- **Section 2.** The Board so finds and determines that it would not produce any advantage to the District to comply with the competitive selection process mandated by Government Code section 4525, et seq. in the procurement of the Additional Work required by the ACEHD.
- **Section 3.** That the District authorizes District staff to enter into a tentative agreement with Kleinfelder, which will be presented to the Board for approval at a subsequent meeting.

Literacy Theory of Action

If we provide early, systematic access to tier 1 reading instruction, as well as research-based targeted literacy interventions, starting in kindergarten and first grade and ensure they are culturally responsive and tailored to meet the needs of African American students, multilingual learners, and students with disabilities...



Then,...we can address learning gaps before they widen. By focusing on foundational reading skills and removing barriers to access, we will help all students, regardless of background or learning needs, achieve grade-level reading proficiency by the end of second grade, setting them up for long-term academic success.

The Why



- 88% of students who struggle with reading at the end of first grade will continue to struggle in fourth grade if they don't receive effective interventions.
- Brain science tells us that the regions forming the reading network in the brain mainly develop during kindergarten and first grade.
- Early reading success is strongly linked to future academic achievement, including high school graduation rates.

Action Steps Taken

- Gathered teacher and site leader feedback through listening sessions and walkthroughs
- Solidified and revised our AUSD Literacy Framework as our north star vision for literacy instruction in AUSD by June of 2025
- Conducted a curriculum review and pilot process to recommend a new ELA curriculum for full Adoption in Spring of 2026
- Identified the best ways to offer curriculum agnostic professional learning beginning next school year 2025-26
- Convened a pilot committee made up of 32 teachers across the district
- Adopted and Implemented Amira as AUSD's Early Reading Risk Screener

Current Progress


- Developed a page to the <u>AUSD website</u> that articulates the AUSD's Literacy Program as well
 as provides resources for families to support literacy in the home
- Beginning to use the AUSD Literacy Framework to support curriculum agonistic professional learning
- Currently piloting Wonders, will pilot Benchmark late fall, and EL Education in January
- Pilot committee meets monthly
- Established a scope and sequence to ensure learning continues to happen during the pilot
- Adopted and are implementing Amira as AUSD's Early Reading Difficulties Screener
- Launched Ignite Reading, a Tier 3 reading program at Ruby, Love, and Maya Lin

The AUSD K-5 ELA Discovery Committee is responsible for analyzing curriculum against a shared set of criteria for high-quality materials aligned to the CA common core standards as well as supporting the pilot of those materials to determine a recommendation for an FLA curriculum in the Spring of 2026.









Highlighting our Literacy Priorities for Families

One of the three Focus Areas in <u>AUSD's 2023</u> Strategic Plan is to construct a "strong foundational program for all students." A key component of that foundational program is the creation of a rigorous literacy program in pre-K through 3rd grade, so that students develop the critical reading skills on which they will rely throughout their academic journey.

Since 2023, AUSD staff have been focused on developing a literacy framework that includes effective curriculum, consistent professional development, and multiple supports.



Next Steps

- Continue to pilot ELA curriculum, including visiting classrooms during ELA instruction
- Pilot committee makes a recommendation to the Board in the spring
- Develop a professional learning plan to support both curriculum implementation and explicit, research-based instructional practices aligned with the AUSD Literacy Framework and the science of reading
- Board Update on Amira, AUSD's Early Reading Difficulties Screener, on October 14th

In order to be eligible to receive funds available for the purposes of this article, districts must conduct an annual public hearing to determine whether each pupil in the district has sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, that are aligned to the content standards adopted pursuant to Section 60605 in each of the following subjects, as appropriate, that are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum framework adopted by the state

board:

- Mathematics
- Science
- History-social science
- English/language arts, including the English language development component of an adopted program

Staff will seek final approval of this Resolution at the October 14, 2025 Board of Education Meeting.

Ed Code

Education Code §60119 states in part:

In order to be eligible to receive funds available for purposes of this article, the governing board of a school district shall take the following actions:

- Hold a public hearing and make a determination, through a resolution, as to whether each pupil in each school in the school district has sufficient textbooks and/or instructional materials that are aligned to the content standards adopted by the state board in each of the following subjects:
 - Mathematics
 - Science
 - History-Social Science
 - English Language Arts, including the English language development component of an adopted program

Ed Code, cont...

- The public hearing shall take place on or before the end of the eighth week from the first day pupils attend school for that year
- The governing board of a school district shall make a written determination as to whether each pupil enrolled in a world language or health course has sufficient textbooks or instructional material that are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum frameworks adopted by the state board for those subjects. The governing board shall also determine the availability of laboratory science equipment as applicable to science laboratory courses offered in grades 9-12, inclusive.

Notice of Public Hearing

Additionally, per <u>Education Code §60119</u>:

- The governing board of a school district shall provide 10 days notice of the public hearing
- The notice shall contain the time, place, and purpose of the hearing and shall be posted in three public places in the school district
- The hearing shall be held at a time that will encourage the attendance of teachers, and parents and guardians of pupils who attend the schools in the school district and shall not take place during or immediately following school hours

- 1. The Alameda Unified School District Website
- 2. The <u>City of Alameda</u> Website
- 3. The <u>Alameda Free Library</u> Website
- 4. The kiosk at the District Office



Timeline

- Public Hearing: September 30, 2025
 - October 6th marks 8 weeks since the start of the school year
- Approval of Resolution: October 14, 2025
 - Includes sign off by school site Principals

CERTIFICATION OF REQUIREMENT OF EDUCATION CODE SECTION 60119 FOR SUFFICIENCY OF PUPIL TEXTBOOKS AND INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS INCENTIVE PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the Governing Board of Alameda City Unified School District, in order to comply with the requirements of Education Code section 60119, held a public hearing on September 30, 2025, at approximately 7:00 pm, which is on or before the eighth week of school and which did not take place during or immediately following school hours; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Board provided at least 10 day notice of the public hearing posted in at least three public places within the district that stated the time, place, and purpose of the hearing, and

WHEREAS, the Governing Board encouraged participation by parents, teachers, members of the community, and bargaining unit leaders in the public hearing; and

WHEREAS, information provided at the public hearing and to the Governing Board at the public meeting detailed the extent to which textbooks and instructional materials were provided to all students, including English learners, in the district/county office of education; and

WHEREAS, the definition of "sufficient textbooks or instructional materials" means that each pupil has textbook or instructional materials, or both, to use in class and to take home; and

WHEREAS, the definition of "sufficient textbooks or instructional materials" also means that all students who are enrolled in the same course within the Alameda Unified School District have standards-aligned textbooks or instructional materials from the same adoption cycle; and

WHEREAS, sufficient textbooks and instructional materials were provided to each student, including English Learners, which are aligned to the academic content standards and consistent with the cycles and content of the curriculum frameworks within the following subjects:

- Mathematics
- Science
- History-Social Science
- English/Language arts, including the English Language Development component of an adopted program; and

WHEREAS, sufficient textbooks or instructional materials were provided to each pupil enrolled in foreign language or health classes; and

WHEREAS, laboratory science equipment was available for science laboratory classes offered in grades 9-12, inclusive;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that for the 2025-2026 school year, the Alameda Unified School District has provided each pupil with sufficient textbooks and instructional materials aligned to the academic content standards and consistent with the cycles and content of the curriculum frameworks.

Background: With the recent resignation of Board Member Meleah Hall, there is currently a

vacant seat on AUSD's Board of Education. Board Bylaw 9223 outlines the two options for filling a vacant Board seat: calling a special election, or

appointing an applicant.

A special election can cost between \$50,000 - \$250,000. If the Board chooses to appoint a new Board member, there is no cost, and the interview and selection process must be done publicly. The Board must act to fill the seat within 60 days of the date of resignation (September 23, 2025).

Today, Board members will discuss their two options and take action to decide which process they would like to follow to fill the vacant Board seat.

Process for Filling a Board Vacancy

- With former Board Member Meleah Hall resigning from the Board, there is a vacant seat on the Board of Education. That term was to run through November of 2028.
- Education Code gives the Board two options for filling the vacant seat:
 - 1. Calling a special election; or
 - 2. Appointing an applicant
 - a. Appointed member will serve until the next election in November 2026
 - b. Member elected in November 2026 will serve until the end of the term originally filled by the member who created the vacancy

Events Causing a Vacancy

A vacancy on the Governing Board may arise from any of the following events:

- 1. The death of an incumbent (Government Code 1770)
- 2. The adjudication pursuant to a quo warranto proceeding declaring that an incumbent is physically or mentally incapacitated due to disease, illness, or accident and that there is reasonable cause to believe that the incumbent will not be able to perform the duties of the office for the remainder of the term (Government Code 1770)
- 3. A Board member's resignation in accordance with Board Bylaw 9222 Resignation (Government Code 1770)
- 4. A Board member's removal from office by recall (Elections Code 11000-11386; Government Code 1770)
- 5. A Board member's ceasing to be a resident of the district (Government Code 1770)
- 6. A Board member's ceasing to inhabit the trustee area represented by the Board member (Government Code 1770)
- 7. A Board member's absence from the state for more than 60 days, except in the following situations: (Government Code 1064, 1770)
 - a. Upon district business with the approval of the Board
 - b. With the consent of the Board for an additional period not to exceed a total absence of 90 days or, in the case of illness or other urgent necessity and upon a proper showing thereof, for more than 90 days
 - c. For federal military deployment, not to exceed an absence of a total of six months, as a member of the armed forces of the United States or the California National Guard
 - If the absence of the Board member for this purpose exceeds six months, the Board may approve an additional six-month absence upon a showing that there is a reasonable expectation that the member will return within the second six-month period, and the Board may appoint an interim member to serve during the absence. If two or more Board members are absent by reason of these circumstances, and those absences result in the inability to establish a quorum at a regular meeting, the Board may immediately appoint one or more interim members as necessary to enable the Board to conduct business and discharge its responsibilities. The term of an interim member appointed in these circumstances shall not extend beyond the return of the absent Board member or beyond the next regularly scheduled election for that office, whichever occurs first.
- 8. A Board member's ceasing to discharge the duties of the office for the period of three consecutive months, except when prevented by sickness or when absent from the state with the permission required by law (Government Code 1770)
- 9. A Board member's conviction of a felony or any offense involving a violation of official duties or conviction of a designated crime resulting in a forfeiture of office (Government Code 1770, 3000-3003)
- 10. A Board member's refusal or neglect to file the required oath within the time prescribed (Government Code 1770)

- 11. The decision of a competent tribunal declaring void a Board member's election or appointment (Government Code 1770)
- 12. A Board member's commitment to a hospital or sanitarium as a drug addict, dipsomaniac, inebriate, or stimulant addict by a court of competent jurisdiction, in which case the office shall not be deemed vacant until the order of commitment has become final (Government Code 1770)
- 13. A "failure to elect" in which no candidate or an insufficient number of candidates have filed to run for a Board seat(s) (Education Code 5090, 5326, 5328)

Timelines for Filling a Vacancy

When a vacancy occurs, the Board shall take the following action, as appropriate:

- 1. When a vacancy occurs within four months of the end of a Board member's term, the Board shall take no action. (Education Code 5093)
- 2. When a vacancy occurs between six months and 130 days before a regularly scheduled Board election at which the vacant position is not scheduled to be filled, the vacancy shall be filled by a special election consolidated with the regular election. The person so elected shall take office at the first regularly scheduled Board meeting following the certification of the election and shall serve only until the end of the term of the position which the person was elected to fill. (Education Code 5093)
- 3. When a vacancy occurs any time outside of the statutory time windows identified in Items #1 and #2 above, the Board shall either order an election or make a provisional appointment within 60 days of the date of the vacancy or the filing of the member's deferred resignation, whichever is sooner. (Education Code 5091, 5093)

Eligibility for Appointment

In order to be appointed to fill a vacancy on the Board, a person must meet the eligibility requirements specified in law and Board Bylaw 9220 - Governing Board Elections.

Provisional Appointments

When, as authorized by law, the Board has opted to make a provisional appointment to fill a vacancy, the Board, by resolution, may approve the procedures for selecting the person to be provisionally appointed to fill the vacancy. These procedures may, but are not required to, include the following:

- 1. Advertising in the local media to solicit candidate applications
- 2. Establishing a committee consisting of less than a quorum of the Board to ensure that applicants are eligible for Board membership and announce the names of the eligible candidates
- 3. Interviewing the candidates at a public meeting

Within 10 days after the Board makes a provisional appointment to fill a Board vacancy, the Superintendent or designee, on behalf of the Board, shall post a notice of the actual vacancy, or the filing of a deferred resignation, and the provisional appointment. The Superintendent or designee shall post the notice as follows: (Education Code 5092)

- 1. In three public places in the district or, if applicable, trustee area
- 2. On the district's website
- 3. In a newspaper of general circulation published in the district, if such a newspaper exists

The notice shall contain: (Education Code 5092)

- 1. The fact of the vacancy or resignation
- 2. The date of the occurrence of the vacancy or the date of the filing of, and the effective date of, the resignation
- 3. The full name of the provisional appointee to the Board and the date of the provisional appointee's appointment
- 4. A statement notifying the voters that unless a petition calling for a special election pursuant to Education Code 5091 is filed in the office of the County Superintendent of Schools within 30 days of the provisional appointment, the appointment shall become effective

The person appointed shall only hold office until the next regularly scheduled election for district Board members. (Education Code 5091)

If within 30 days of the Board's appointment, registered voters of the district or, where elections are by trustee areas, of the trustee area, submit a petition for special election that the County Superintendent determines to be legally sufficient, the provisional appointment is terminated, and a special election shall be held in accordance with Education Code 5091 to fill the vacancy.

Appointment Due to Failure to Elect

When a vacancy occurs because no candidate or an insufficient number of candidates have been nominated and a district election will not be held, the Board shall appoint a qualified person to the office. This appointment shall be made at a meeting prior to the day fixed for the election and the appointee shall be seated at the organizational meeting as if elected at the district election. (Education Code 5328)

When an appointment is being made because of a failure to elect, the district shall publish a notice once in a newspaper of general circulation published in the district, or if no such newspaper exists, in a newspaper having general circulation within the district. This notice shall state that the Board intends to make an appointment and shall inform persons of the procedure available for applying for the appointment. (Education Code 5328.5)

When, as authorized by law, the Board seeks to make an appointment because of a failure to elect, the Board, by resolution, may approve any additional the procedures for selecting the person to be appointed to fill the vacancy.
